

WHITTLING AND WEAVING INCURSION

This creative and hands-on based workshop looks at using and creating tools as a form of technology. Aimed at Years 3-7, children will learn specific skills in whittling to create a tool and a woven art piece of their own.

A valuable opportunity to take risks confidently and practice self-control and persistence.

This workshop provides strong connections to indigenous culture, links to the Australian curriculum outcomes and real world experiences that empower children to develop and extend their sense of self.

Suitable for schools, vacation care programs, OSHC services and community groups.

- Workshop 1 – Whittling in Nature:**
 Students are provided with hands on experience to transform an everyday stick into a unique piece of their own. Drawing on indigenous connections as well as design and technology thinking skills, this workshop offers children opportunity to enjoy the therapeutic nature of whittling, to use their creativity and to learn to use whittling tools safely to produce a tool of their own.
- Workshop 2 – Nature Weaving:**
 Drawing on the ancient art of Indigenous weaving, students will appreciate the tactile and aesthetic appeal of natural fibres and materials as they learn skills in weaving their own mat or basket. Children can also have opportunity to participate in weaving on a large natural loom to create a piece of temporary art work. This workshop uses needles as tools for creating, but will also help build a connection to aboriginal culture and indigenous history
