# Feature Spaces

- 1 EVENT INFO MARQUEE** Come and see us at the green Nature Play SA info marquee for enquiries or assistance. You can also pick up a self-guided walking map to wander throughout Felixstow Reserve at your own pace and take in the natural surrounds and cultural interpretation.
- 2 NATURE PLAY SA POP-UP SHOP** Come and browse in our pop-up shop. All proceeds help us to achieve our vision. We have waterproof onesies, nature books, art supplies, gifts and more on offer. Event special: buy one kite for \$10.00 or 2 for \$15.00.
- 3 KITE FLYING** Purchase a kite from our pop-up shop and decorate it, or simply sit back and watch the kites fly.
- 4 LOOSE PARTS PLAY TENT** Discover a secret world of natural loose parts play within our beautiful bell tent.
- 5 READING TENT** Take some time out and spend quality screen free time reading in our bell tent.
- 6 JUNK PLAY** Junk Play is taking recycling and sustainability to a whole new level – build things and make some music with a range of interesting and creative junk.
- 7 NATURE POTIONS** Natural loose parts, pots, pans, teapots and more set the stage for creative open-ended play and experimentation.
- 8 NATURE CRAFT** Create spring masks that will ignite your child's imagination.
- 9 ORIENTEERING** Learn about map reading and navigation with the folk from Active Education! After a brief introduction, you will embark on the course.
- 10 BEAUTIFUL BEES** Create a happy environment for native bees. Children will help in the production of the next generation of pollinators. Children can participate in a bee hotel workshop where they will be able to make a bee hotel to take home.
- 11 CULTURAL WALKS** Enjoy a serene cultural walk through the wetlands. Cultural walks leaving from the Cultural Hub will occur at 12:00pm, 1:00pm and 2:00pm.
- 12 EXPERIMENTING WITH OCHRE** Experiment with the ancient art of using ochre and learn the cultural significance of its use.
- 13 CUBBIES** Collect your ration of hessian and rope from the cubby station and channel your inner Bear Grylls to create a shelter from fallen sticks and natural materials.
- 14 POND DIPPING** Come join our friends from NRM Education as they collect and identify water bugs – a fun and educational activity!

# The finer details

- ✔ While there will be trained event support staff on site, the event is being held in an open space and children remain the responsibility of parents and /or carers.
- ✔ Wristbands will be available upon arrival for your child/children. Please write your phone number on it with markers provided, as this enables you to be reunited as promptly as possible should your child become lost. We have a Lost Child Policy that ensures all event staff are trained in what to do should your child get separated from you.
- ✔ If you need assistance please visit the large green Nature Play SA info marquee or see one of our friendly event staff in high-vis vests. Please advise your children that should they get lost they can head to the green marquee or find our event staff who can phone the number on their wristband and enact our Lost Child Policy.
- ✔ This event is a non-smoking and alcohol-free family event.
- ✔ Please minimise the waste you bring to the event and dispose of rubbish thoughtfully in the bins provided.
- ✔ As there is water nearby we encourage you to emphasise water safety with your children.
- ✔ Please feel free to bring your own picnic rug with a packed lunch, alternatively there will be food trucks and coffee (we encourage you to bring a keep cup).
- ✔ We recommend bringing hats, sunscreen, water and a picnic rug.
- ✔ We ask that you support Nature Play's work as a not-for-profit organisation by leaving event materials such as hessian, ropes and books behind so other children and families can enjoy future events.
