5 NATURE CROWNS + MASKS Create a forest-inspired nature crown or mask.

6 NATURAL LOOSE PARTS PLAY Discover a secret world of natural loose parts play inside our beautiful bell tents.

7 LITTLE FOREST WEAVERS Create your own woven nature craft using natural materials, string, and wool - perfect for relaxing, creative play.

8 HEALTH PARTNERS WELLNESS TRAIL A playful, accessible trail where families explore through movement, creative challenges, and interactive discovery.

9 NATURE POTIONS AND TINKERING Natural loose parts, pots, pans, teapots and more set the stage for creative open-ended play and experimentation.

11 GEOCACHING Explore the forest and learn about nature with the support of GPS technology.

12 OFFICE FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT (OECD) An engaging space for families to explore early childhood resources, connect with experts, and discover playful activities that support learning, development and wellbeing.

13 NATURE WANDS Craft your own magical wand using natural materials—perfect for imaginative play and nature adventures.

14 SA WATER EXPLORE, PLAY + LEARN Catch and learn about SA's fish species, size limits, and conservation. Discover how water moves from reservoirs to your tap!

15 NATURE WALKS Take a 30-minute guided family nature walk where you'll spot beautiful wildflowers, butterflies and maybe some Wilampas. Walks depart at **10.45am, 11.45am, 12.45pm and 1.45pm.**

16 ABORIGINAL MESSAGE STONES Create message stones and learn about Aboriginal art and symbols used for passing on knowledge with Aboriginal artist Warumungu/Yuggera man David Booth.

17 BUSH STICK XYLOPHONES Come play a bush stick xylophone in this experimental music session.

18 YOGA Join us for a session of forest Yoga with age-appropriate yoga sequences including songs, movement, fun yoga games and partner poses. **Make sure to register at the location on the day.** Maximum of 25 participants per session.
